A Message from the Chief Radiologist



Rapid diagnosis of stroke is a crucial element on the way to successful treatment, a role in which Imaging On Call takes very seriously. IOC radiologists provide interpretations for stroke studies in 10 minutes or less. Our time-tested procedure ensures rapid transmission of images, speedy diagnosis and reporting of stroke studies. The clinical staff of the admitting hospital will inform our workflow team of an incoming "brain attack". Workflow will immediately transmit the images, complete with history

and clinical information. One of our radiology experts will prioritize the study and issue a rapid report back to the clinician. Once the report is transmitted, the IOC radiologist will contact the clinician by phone to make certain the report was received and to discuss any additional significant findings.

With the advent of new and more sophisticated methods of stroke therapy, rapid treatment of stroke is more important than ever. Intravenous and intra-arterial lysis of cerebral artery thrombus, as well as administration of neuroprotective agents must be done quickly and efficiently. The faster a stroke is treated, the more chance there is of a neurologic recovery.

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Stroke Protocol Procedure

Imaging On Call has an excellent record of providing superior care to stroke patients. IOC Workflow Coordinators work quickly to coordinate the best care for each patient and maintain an average turnaround time of less than 10 minutes.

1. Patient scan performed at customer facility.
2. Customer calls to let IOC know they will be sending a stroke protocol study.
3. Once patient study arrives in IOC servers, Workflow Coordinators assign the study to a radiologist as a top priority.
4. The radiologist reads the study and posts a report online.
5. The IOC reading radiologist will call the referring physician with critical findings.
